Guidelines

- 1. The official name of our agency is 180 Turning Lives Around, Inc. This name must be used in all publicity and promotional materials.
- 2. 180 must be advertised as the only agency in Monmouth County serving victims of domestic violence and sexual assault.
- 3. We do not use the word "shelter" in the title of our organization. Our shelter program is only one of the many programs offered by 180.
- 4. Organizers are not permitted to open a bank account in the name of 180 Turning Lives Around. Please have checks be made out to '180 Turning Lives Around;' online payments through the agency website is encouraged. *Please keep track of all monetary and donated items so donors can receive an acknowledgement for tax purposes.
- 5. The agency is not responsible for any expenses, and will not provide any reimbursements for any incurred losses.
- 6. Please notify 180's Development Office if:
 - a. there is more than one beneficiary
 - b. publicity is needed at the event
 - c. staff presence is needed
- 7. Please notify 180's Development Office within three days of your event to advise of the amount raised and when we can expect funds. Since we receive funds from the various government resources, we must advise our auditors to keep our financial reports uniform.
